PFFOW is taking entries in four categories — literature, film, photography, and visual arts.

Only new pieces of artwork that relate to this year’s theme may be submitted. Each entry must be made by a single student.

Category Requirements

Visual Arts: Accepted forms include painting, drawing, ceramics, sculpture, collage, computer generated images, crafts, and mixed media. 2D artworks must be mounted on sturdy material and 3D works must be stable. No size requirement as long as art is stable.

Literature: Accepted forms of fiction and nonfiction include: poetry, short stories, reflective essays, plays, screenplays, and comics. Entries may be written in any language with an interpretive English translation. Writing must be under 2,000 words. Entries may be handwritten or typed and in .pdf format.

Film: Accepted forms include narrative, documentary and experimental. Videos must be 5 minutes or less and no larger than 1GB in size. acceptable formats include: .MOV, .M4V, .MP4 and on a CD or USB drive labeled with your name and grade.

Photography: Must be a single printed or digital image using any chosen technique. Printed images must be mounted on study material and digital submissions must be a JPEG or JPG.

Students must submit their artwork and entry form to the main office by Friday January 12th at 3pm, the week after school resumes from winter break.

Parents, Families, and Faculty of Washington (PFFOW) is proud to sponsor an art competition celebrating student works that explore the Marmalade District, the neighborhood that surrounds our school.

Students may draw inspiration from architecture, diverse cultures, historic landmarks and individuals, and the fruit trees that make our neighborhood special.

Entries will be reviewed by local artists Randee Levine, David Pace, and Spy Hop with winners announced at the February Student of the Month Assembly. **Winning artwork will be displayed at the Marmalade Branch Library, Salt Lake Acting Company, and the School Arts & Culture Night.**
