2) Program Updates

- a) **Literacy Night (March 1):** Plan for food was made at last meeting and will be managed in collaboration with the office. We've given parent feedback from STEM night and beyond managing the Book Fair, no additional needs.
 - b) **Book Fair (Feb 28-March 8?):** Sign-ups being modified for Non Student Day; Heather working w/Liz and teachers to change. Possible extension to accommodate all students and additional before school time and online preview.
 - c) **Art Contest:** 34 entries and some lessons learned (better collection of forms, trying to balance genres). Professional judges awarded category winners and exceptional entries but also, all awards are named after well-known artists and all entries will receive an award. Laurie and Ashley going to library 2/8 at 10:30; remaining entries to SLAC and all entries at Art Night; Meghann helping proof certificates; announcements made during BIC whenever complete; Approved costs for rubber cement/poster for mounting/Laurie will request reimbursement.
 - d) **Bee the Good:** Assembly w/Hank Smith will introduce the spring theme and include a video describing that: the INbox will continue but students can also complete good deeds linked to bracelets, when deeds are complete bracelets will go in the fabulously decorated entry area (thanks Sarah and Meghann!!)
- 3) **Faculty Requests:** 1st grade requesting \$596.92 (16 of total for shipping) for listening centers that use cassette or CD for existing inventory.
